<u>Title 1 Parent Info Night...in case you missed it!</u>

Thank you to those parents who attended last month's Title 1 Parent Info Night! In case you were unable to attend, here are a few highlights and main takeaways:

- Title 1 is a federally funded program that provides additional academic support and learning opportunities for students at schools with high percentages of students with a socioeconomically disadvantaged background. Our Free/Reduced Lunch percentage is 46%.
- Rocky Run is a "School-Wide" Title 1 School. This means that Title 1 funding can be used to support the learning of ALL students. There are 7 other Title 1 schools in Stafford County.




